
The WV SAF Executive Committee met following the banquet. Thursday's events started with the WV SAF Business Meeting. Topics included: recent WVU SAF Student Chapter activities by vice president, Sean Baldwin, Dave Hill's update on legislative activities regarding efforts to sunset the WV Board of registration for Foresters, a review of the Appalachian Forest Heritage Area program by Joe Lancaster, comments from new Director of the Davis College of Agriculture, Natural Resources and Design – Division of Forestry and Natural Resources, Dr. Robert Burns, Roger Sherman's report on recent legislative issues, Joe Tekel's heartfelt thoughts on the importance of the logging industry and Randy Dye's update on the West Virginia Division of Forestry. The group voted to provide \$500 to offset the costs of the student chapter attending this year's National Convention. The possibility of initiating a scholarship/internship program was also discussed. Dr. Jamie Schuler presented outreach opportunities associated with the upcoming National Boy Scout Jamboree to be held in WV in 2017. Plans for the Winter/Spring meeting were also discussed. Topics presented during the Thursday session were varied. The session began with Dr. Dave McGill making a presentation about Wood Products in WV and the Appalachian Hardwood Center's efforts to support WV's wood industry. Amy Hill of the USFS, State and Private Forestry in Morgantown gave an update on diseases and pests affecting WV forests. Arlyn Perkey reviewed some of the lessons he has learned in retirement while managing his woodlot in at Catherine's Knob. WVU's Dr. Jim Rentch reported on red spruce restoration efforts. USFS employees, Dr. Tom Schuler and Dr. Jan Wiedenbeck discussed climate/forest adaptation and the latest in wood quality research respectively. Dr. Jamie Schuler closed the meeting with a report on his research on the use of strip cutting to regenerate oaks.

Student Leadership Award

The purpose of this award is to recognize a forestry student who exemplifies the leadership capabilities desired in future forestry professionals. Nomination Form:

National SAF Awards

Through national recognition the Society of American Foresters selects recipients in the categories of Forest Science & Technology, Communications, and Professional Recognition. Nominations for national awards are due to the national office by February 28th yearly.

Fellows

One of the highest honors for members of the Society. This exceptional recognition is bestowed upon a member by their peers for outstanding contributions and service to the Society and the profession. All nomination packets must be received by the national office by February 28 yearly.

Presidential Field Forester Award

Through presidential direction, eleven members (one from each of the eleven SAF districts) will be selected to receive an outstanding field forester achievement award. This process will assure that each region of the United States will be able to recognize an outstanding field forester. Members must forward all nominations to their district Council Representative by May 15th yearly.

Student Awards

An Outstanding Student Chapter Award is presented yearly. Applications are due to the national office by June 20.
